

Rehabilitating the land we mine for the future

At Alcoa, rehabilitating the land after bauxite mining is not an afterthought, it's a key part of how we operate.

Planning starts long before land is disturbed, informed by ongoing research dating back about half a century, and monitoring continues as native plant species mature.

Over the last rehabilitation season, we conducted landscaping and returned seed-rich topsoil across about 720 hectares where mining has been completed. We also planted about 745,000 native seedlings.

Today, more than 75 per cent of the total area we have cleared for mining over more than 60 years of operation is at different stages of rehabilitation from freshly planted to decades old.
